Anointing of the Sick: The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be offered after the 11:15 a.m. Mass on the 2nd Sunday of each month. In an emergency please call the Rectory.

*Wednesday, February 10 is Ash Wednesday the beginning of the holy season of Lent. Pope Francis in his Lenten Message asks, “the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God’s mercy.” To assist us here at St. Charles to respond to Pope Francis’ call we are sharing with you the full text of the Pope’s Lenten Message. We are also making available to you a pocket sized booklet “**Living Lent with Mercy.**” The booklet offers you food for prayer and reflection for each day of Lent with scripture references. As you will note from the Pope’s message he is encouraging all to “prayerful listening to God’s Word.*

*Additionally, beginning with Ash Wednesday we here at St. Charles will have **in addition to the 12:10 p.m. daily Mass a 7:30 a.m. Mass Monday through Friday.** The Eucharist is perhaps the greatest gift of God’s mercy shared with us and the opportunity to participate in daily Mass during the Lenten season is a great way to grow closer to the Lord. I hope that the opportunity for 7:30 a.m. Mass enables those going to work to start each Lenten day with the Lord who can then give direction to our living of each day.*

*Also during Lent there will be the **opportunity for daily prayer before the Blessed Sacrament from 9 a.m. till noon Monday to Friday.** All are invited to stop by and spend time with Jesus.*

*Finally, Lent is a special time to remember our less fortunate sisters and brothers. To assist us I invite each family/individual to take a **Rice Bowl provided by Catholic Relief Services.** Please use the Rice Bowl to daily contribute to feeding the hungry. I invite you to return your Rice Bowl with your donation during Holy Week. Pope Francis states “the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favorable time to overcome our existential alienation by listening to God’s word and by practicing the works of mercy.”*

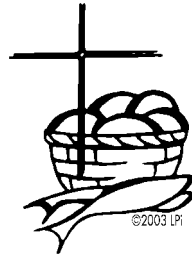
