Days 7 through 9



Novena in Honor of St. Charles Borromeo October 27th – November 4th Feast Day, November 4th Saint Charles Borromeo (1538-1584) was the Archbishop of Milan and a Cardinal, as well as the Papal Secretary of State under Pope Pius IV. He was one of the drafters of the first Catechism of the Catholic Church, a leader of the Catholic Reformation, and an innovator of religious education, especially for children—establishing what is commonly known as "Sunday School." He performed many works of charity and selflessly ministered to the sick during a serious outbreak of bubonic plague.

Saint Charles Borromeo is the patron saint of learning and the arts and of catechists. His feast day is November 4th.
