



# Gospel

MT 25:1-13

Jesus told his disciples this parable:



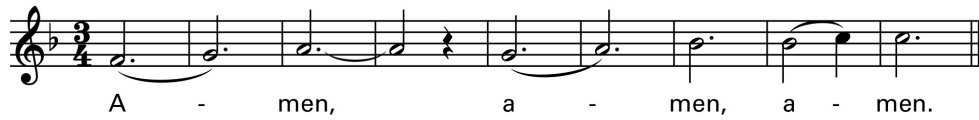

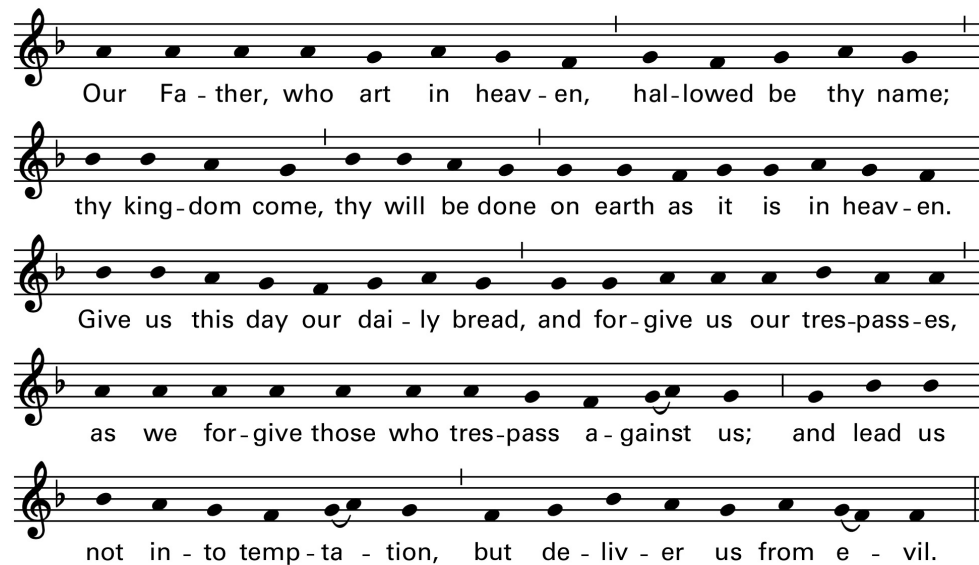
