

He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp.”

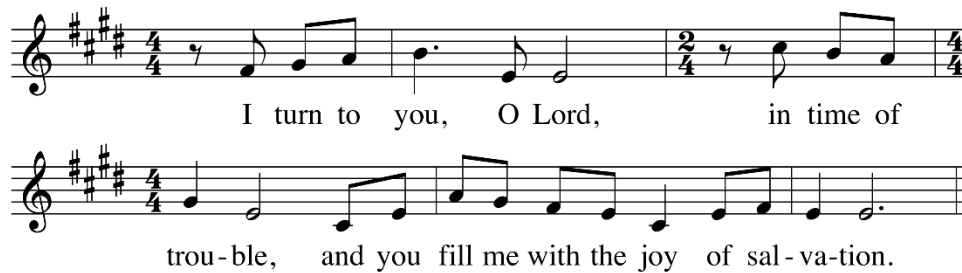


An Act of Spiritual Communion (St. Alphonsus de Liguori)
