INTRODUCTION

Leader: God, + come to my assistance.

All: Lord, make haste to help me.

Leader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:

PSALMODY

Psalm 122: Holy city, Jerusalem You have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, heavenly Jerusalem (Hebrews 12:22)

Antiphon:

Leader: Jesus said to Mary: Woman, why are you weeping?

All: Whom do you seek?

Leader: I rejoiced when I heard them say: "Let us go to God's house."
And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem.

All: Jerusalem is built as a city strongly compact. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord.

Psalm Prayer

Make all nations come to your Church to share in your gifts in fellowship, that they may render you thanks without end and come to your eternal city.

Psalm 127: Apart from God our labors are worthless *You are God's building* (1 Corinthians 3:9)

Antiphon:

Leader: They have taken my Lord away,

All: and I do not know where they have put him.

If the Lord does not build the house, in vain do its builders labor; if the Lord does not watch over the city, in vain do the watchers keep vigil.

In vain is your earlier rising, your going later to rest, you who toil for the bread you eat, when he pours gifts on his beloved while they slumber.

Antiphon
