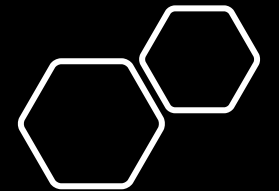

All: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

PSALMODY

Psalm 116:10-19 Thanksgiving in the Temple

Through Christ let us offer God a continual sacrifice of praise (Hebrews 13:15)

Antiphon:

Leader: Look well, all you peoples

All: **and see my suffering.**

Leader: I trusted, even when I said:

“I am sorely afflicted,”

and when I said in my alarm:

“No man can be trusted.”

All: **How can I repay the Lord**

for his goodness to me?

The cup of salvation I will raise;

I will call on the Lord’s name.

My vows to the Lord I will fulfill

before all his people.

O precious in the eyes of the Lord

is the death of his faithful.

**Your servant, Lord, your servant am I;
you have loosened my bonds.**

A thanksgiving sacrifice I make:

I will call on the Lord’s name.

My vows to the Lord I will fulfill

before all his people,

in the courts of the house of the Lord,

in your midst, O Jerusalem.

Antiphon:

Psalm Prayer

Leader: Father, precious in your sight is the death of the saints, but precious above all is the love with which Christ suffered to redeem us. In this life we fill up in our own flesh what is still lacking in the sufferings of Christ; accept this as our sacrifice of praise, and we shall even now taste the joy of the new Jerusalem.

Psalm 143:1-11: Prayer in distress
A man is not justified by observance of the law but only through faith in Jesus Christ (Galatians 2:16)

Antiphon:

Leader: My soul is in anguish,
All: **my heart is in torment.**

Lord, listen to my prayer:
turn your ear to my appeal.
You are faithful, you are just; give answer.
Do not call your servant to judgment
for no one is just in your sight.

**The enemy pursues my soul;
he has crushed my life to the ground;
he has made me dwell in darkness
like the dead, long forgotten.
Therefore my spirit fails;
my heart is numb within me.**

I remember the days that are past:
I ponder all your works.
I muse on what your hand has wrought
and to you I stretch out my hands.
Like a parched land my soul thirsts for you.

**Lord, make haste and answer;
for my spirit fails within me.
Do not hide your face
lest I become like those in the grave.**

In the morning let me know your love
for I put my trust in you.
Make me know the way I should walk:
to you I lift up my soul.

**Rescue me, Lord, from my enemies;
I have fled to you for refuge.
Teach me to do your will
for you, O Lord, are my God.
Let your good spirit guide me
in ways that are level and smooth.**

For your name's sake, Lord, save my life;
in your justice save my soul from distress.

Psalm Prayer

Leader: Lord Jesus, early in the morning of your resurrection, you made your love known and brought the first light of dawn to those who dwell in darkness. Your death has opened a path for us. Do not enter into judgment with your servants; let your Holy Spirit guide us together into the land of justice.

Canticle: Philippians 2:6-11 Christ, God's holy servant

Antiphon

Leader: When Jesus had taken the vinegar, he said: "It is accomplished."

All: **Then he bowed his head and died.**

Though he was in the form of God,
Jesus did not deem equality with God
something to be grasped at.

**Rather, he emptied himself
and took the form of a slave,
being born in the likeness of men.**

He was known to be of human estate,
and it was thus that he humbled himself,
obediently accepting even death,
death on a cross!

**Because of this,
God highly exalted him
and bestowed on him the name
above every other name,**

So that at Jesus' name
every knee must bend
in the heavens, on the earth,
and under the earth,
and every tongue proclaim
to the glory of God the Father:
JESUS CHRIST IS LORD!

**Glory to the Father, and to the Son,

Antiphon

Leader: When Jesus had taken the vinegar, he said: "It is accomplished."

All: **Then he bowed his head and died.**

READING: 1 Peter 2:21-24

Christ suffered for you, and left you an example, to have you follow in his footsteps. He did no wrong; no deceit was found in his mouth. When he was insulted, he returned no insult. When he was made to suffer, he did not counter with threats. Instead, he delivered himself up to the One who judges justly. In his own body he brought your sins to the cross, so that all of us, dead to sin, could live in accord with God's will. By his wounds you were healed.

Antiphon

Reader: For our sake Christ was obedient,
All: **accepting even death, death on a cross.**

GOSPEL CANTICLE

Canticle of Mary: Luke 1:46-55

The soul rejoices in the Lord

Leader: When we were his enemies,
All: **God reconciled us to himself by the death of his Son.**

My + soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

By the merits of your Son's death, hear us, Lord.
